

Reading the Migration Library

Reading the Migration Library (RML) is a long-running artist project made up of events and publications about migration and displacement. Lois Klassen initiated the project in 2016. Deanne Achong produced the project website (readingthemigrationlibrary.com) in 2021. In 2024 Klassen and Achong worked together to co-host the final phase of RML projects in the series, *Undercurrents and Folds*. The titles that were produced in all three phases of the project are listed below.

RML1: Communities and Connections, the first RML series, was produced in the years 2016 to 2018 (with an additional title in 2023), in partnership with organizations in New Westminster (BC), Santa Fe (NM), Vancouver (BC) and Kingston, (ON). RML1 publications included simple folded pamphlets made in community workshops as well as elaborate chapbooks using innovative binding and printing by writers from SFU's The Writing Studio.

RML2: Poetics and Actions, the second RML series (2020-2021) was produced during the COVID19 pandemic and carried a unifying design by book designer Victoria Lum. A group of commissioned artists and writers produced artist books in partnership with Library of Africa and the African Diaspora (Accra, Ghana) and with funding from the BC Arts Council and Canada Council for the Arts.

RML3: Undercurrents and Folds (2024) is hosted collaboratively by Lois Klassen (Vancouver) and Deanne Achong (Newfoundland). From either side of Turtle Island, Klassen and Achong have assembled a group of artists who offer creative responses to topics of displacement, diaspora, arrivals and failed arrivals, travel over sovereign Indigenous territory, and the violence of forcible containment caused by colonizing states.

Klassen and Achong bring to this phase their past experiences with previous RML publications and events. While Lois Klassen is the founding artist-editor of RML with a hand in creating many of the previous publications and events, Deanne Achong is the web designer-developer behind ReadingtheMigrationLibrary.com (and its parent, LightFactoryPublications.ca), and the artist-author of *Workin' for the Yankee Dollar* (RML1, 2017).
